**SHARED SPECTRUM COMPANY APPOINTS PETER A. TENHULA VICE PRESIDENT FOR
REGULATORY AFFAIRS AND BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT**

Former Head of FCC's Spectrum Policy Task Force and Senior Advisor to Former FCC Chairman Michael Powell will Support Development and Commercial Success of "Smart Radio" Technology

Vienna, VA – The Shared Spectrum Company has announced that Peter A. Tenhula has been named Vice President for Regulatory Affairs and Business Development. In his new position, Tenhula will play a key role in the development, implementation and marketing of dynamic spectrum sharing radios; also know as "smart" or "cognitive" radio technology.

"We are fortunate to have someone with Peter's regulatory expertise in wireless spectrum matters joining our team," said Shared Spectrum Company's Founder and President, Mark McHenry. "He will be an instrumental component in moving spectrum sharing technology to the next level in furtherance of his important policy successes at the FCC."

Tenhula joins Shared Spectrum after serving 15½ years at the Commission. Before leaving the FCC, Tenhula served as Acting Deputy Chief of the FCC's Wireless Telecommunications Bureau and Director of the Spectrum Policy Task Force. Prior to that, he was Senior Legal Advisor to Chairman Michael K. Powell, whom he advised on wireless, international and homeland/national security matters. Tenhula started his career at the FCC in 1990 as a staff attorney in the Video Services Division of the Mass Media Bureau. From 1991-1995, he worked in the Administrative Law Division of the FCC's Office of General Counsel, and from 1995-1997 he served as Special Counsel to then-General Counsel William E. Kennard. In 1997, he joined the staff of then-Commissioner Powell as a Legal Advisor.

Before joining the Commission, Tenhula served as a legal intern with U.S. Representative Michael G. Oxley and the National Association of Broadcasters. Tenhula received his undergraduate degree in Telecommunications (with a Business minor) from Indiana University, Bloomington, and earned a law degree from Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri. He resides in Alexandria, Virginia, with his wife and three young children.
